## Nurse Practitioner

**Reports to:** Clinical Science Department Chair

**Summary:** Primary responsibilities include providing pre-doctoral education and training to WVSOM students, plus all attendant educational activities which may include physical diagnosis, clinical skills, and ACLS. It is expected that the applicant will spend 50% of their time providing patient care at the Robert C. Byrd Clinic.

### Specific Job Functions:

The envisioned academic responsibilities for this position would include:

- Serving as a table trainer in clinical skills labs
- Lecturing on clinical skills topics
- Serving as an ACLS instructor
- Team teaching in the case-based curriculum
- Participating in men and women's health screenings and State Fair Blood Pressure Booth
- Developing continuing education programs in nursing
- Serving as clinical preceptor for first and second year students
- Performing other related duties as assigned

In addition, the candidate will spend half their time involved in patient care at the Robert C. Byrd Clinic. Research is supported and encouraged but not required.

**Qualifications:** A Master's of Science in Nursing, doctorate degree is preferred. The candidate must be eligible to be licensed to practice in the state of West Virginia. Ideally, the successful candidate will have experience in clinical teaching.

**Position:** This is a full-time position with an excellent benefit package including the availability of fully paid malpractice insurance. Faculty appointment is available for

candidates possessing a doctoral degree. This position is exempt from FLSA provisions regarding overtime. Educational loan repayment is negotiable. Salary and faculty rank are commensurate with experience and training.
