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### Happy New Year!

### Do Students Really Watch the Videos?

Did you ever think to yourself, I wonder if students really watch the videos of our lectures? The answer is YES! Looking at the statistics captured by Vimeo for lectures from July 1, 2018 to December 21, 2018, there were approximately 86,000 plays (or views) of the lecture videos in eMedley.

The system also captures what are called “finishes” which is when a video is viewed completely. There were approximately 23,000 finishes. Don't let this number be discouraging because many students do not play the lecture until the very end (until the recording stops). The average percentage of a video that was viewed was eighty percent (80%). In terms of minutes, the average time spent watching videos was 35 minutes and 23 seconds. Given that students can chose to play the video at faster rates, they are getting almost the entire lecture. This data is for both first and second year lectures.

While the stats can't tell us if they are learning, it does tell us that they are using them.

## Missing Tags in eMedley?

If you are missing tags that you remember putting in eMedley in previous terms, check to see if your session for the current term was entered as a new session or if you updated a previous session that was not attached to a date/time in the current term. Often as sessions are added to the schedule, a new session may be added rather than a previous session being revised so that tagging is maintained. If a new session is added, the tagging will not follow. You will have to re-tag the session. It is important to communicate with the Office of Preclinical during the scheduling process to ensure your tagging is not lost when revision to the schedule are made.

Also, if you add or modify tags for a session, it is good practice to go back to the tags after you save to make sure that they “took”. We had one instance in the Fall where a tag had been checked/saved but when the admin went back in, it was gone. There was an issue in the coding that had to be fixed for that item. She had screenshots which was helping to support the issue. Taking a screenshot as evidence of the tagging is always good so that you have proof to support the disappearance. You should save the date/time that the tags were entered and by whom with any screenshots. This will help with tracking issues.

## Update from Exam Center

Steps to Search and View Questions in examn:

1. Navigate to examn in emedley.
2. Select *Search and Print Questions*
3. Under Search for Questions, type the 6 digit Question ID number into the Question ID box near the middle top of the screen.
4. Select *Search*
5. The question with the current version number will appear in the box below the search button.
